Equipment helps apply right fertilizer amount

GETTING the right rate of fertilizer applied where you want it, when you want it, is key in any tillage system. With new technologies emerging, including strip tillage and variable rate application technology, more companies are producing equipment exclusively for these uses.

Here's a couple of products that fit the category.



Orthman dry cart

Orthman's 1TripR ridge-till rig coupled with a 6-ton Valmar dry fertilizer hopper is an ideal combination for farmers trying to reduce the number of passes through a field. The unique setup adds a three-point mounted lifting cart to the rear of the 1TripR, which takes the weight off the tractor and uses the fertilizer cart to lift the ridge-till machine. The dry tender holds 6 tons of product and uses a venture delivery system and hydraulic ground drive. A liquid fertilizer option is available. Two-in-one spreader

Now you can use the same piece of equipment to spread lime or granular fertilizer. The GVM Transpread 8.0 features a specially designed cleated 33-inch belt to ensure constant feed to the spinner disks with virtually no bridging. Unique design spinners allow spread width from 33 to 45 feet when spreading lime and from 66 to 98 feet when spreading fertilizer. Spreading on headlands is easy due to split rear doors that allow spreading to one side only. An optional digital tachometer enables the operator to accurately monitor spinner speed and control spread pattern. Choose from hydraulic or PTO-driven spinners. It's also available with Raven's SCS 4000 or Viper GPS computer controls to operate the drag and spinner controls. List price is \$27,000. Tools prepare soil for better seedbeds

IF you're one of the people shifting to at least some corn after corn, you need a tough disk that can cut through stalks. Or maybe you just need a secondary tillage tool that will make a firm, level seedbed in the spring.

Machinery companies apparently heard your requests. Emphasis on tillage tool lots at farm shows this time around seemed to be on both how to handle more residue if you weren't into leaving lots of it on top, and avoiding ridging in the middle of implement passes, especially when preparing spring seedbeds.

Here's some conventional tillage options that caught the editors' eyes.



Liebrecht soil finisher designed by farmers

New from Liebrecht Manufacturing, the Liebrecht UTT soil finisher is designed to take chiseled ground to planter-ready in one pass. Adjustable heavy-duty knives let you control depth, and knife pitch also can be adjusted. The unit is available in 22-, 27- and 31-foot widths, and it lists for \$775 per foot width. Unverferth rolling harrow

Two new additions to the Unverferth lineup of Rolling Harrow soil conditioners include the 1225 and S1225, pull-tube and semi-mounted models, both of which have durable 1.5-inch serrated steel blades that are angled for ideal action. Plates in the rolling baskets are spaced every 12 inches for durability. The 1225 models have a 5-by-5-inch extendable tongue to match the turning radius of the tillage implement. The models can be adjusted for aggressiveness, allowing operators to tailor the tool to match varying field conditions. Models range from 12 to 50 feet in width, with available red or green paint.
